three *integrated components:*



Medical Care:

after diagnosis, a patient is assigned to a medical team (physician, nurse and social worker), and the team remains constant throughout treatment. This team follows the patient from the outpatient clinic in Scarborough to the BBCH inpatient unit.



Clinical Research:

MCCP is a member of the Children's Oncology Group (COG), the premier research organization for childhood cancer worldwide. MCCP actively participates in clinical research trials, and also collaborates with St. Jude Children's Research Hospital on treatment protocols.



Psycho-social Support Services:

MCCP has three social workers on staff; they help patients and families navigate the traumatic experience of a childhood cancer diagnosis. Social workers provide counseling, therapy and support to patients and families.
